




COVID-19 Spread in Calgary



B117 Variant is ~36% more transmissible \rightarrow 36% \wedge R value than the Original Variant



76 Patients in ICU



Active Cases Doubled since Mar 1



39% of Active Cases due to Variants of Concern



Most Active Cases Per Capita in Canada



Alberta Represents Majority (41%) of all Confirmed Variants in Canada



Test Positivity Rate



R value is approaching 1.2 (transmission rate is increasing rapidly)
